I, George Franco, declare under penalty of perjury that:

- 1. I am a 47-year-old prisoner who has spent 20 years in solitary confinement at the Pelican Bay SHU.
- 2. I was originally validated in 1991 as a member of the Northern Structure gang. In 2008, I was deemed inactive in the Northern Structure gang. At the same time, I was deemed active in the Nuestra Familia gang based on confidential statements by informants claiming that I have a position within the gang, and the fact that my name appeared on gang rosters found in other prisoners' cells. None of the source items relied on to retain me in the SHU for another six years alleged any gang activity, as I understand those words, nor any criminal conduct. True and correct copies of my 2008 inactive review documents can be found at Exhibit H.
- 3. I often do not attend my 180-day reviews because they are a sham. In my experience, the only purpose of the 180-day review is to see if a prisoner wants to debrief.
- 4. I am eligible for parole, but I did not attend my last Parole Board hearing because my experience with the Parole Board is that they will not consider me for parole unless I am released from the SHU. The Parole Board has told me that I need more programming, but to get such programming, I need to get out of the SHU. For example, I took an Alcoholics Anonymous program, but the Parole Board said that I needed to go to "group meetings," which is impossible at the SHU.
- I have eye problems, and I believe this problem is common to a lot of other prisoners at the SHU as well. Since I have been here, I have started getting headaches and had to get glasses.

The SHU is very loud, which often prevents me from getting sleep and increase	
anxiety. I often hear buzzing in my ears.	

Between May 2010 and February 2011, I was on mail restriction and was tinable to write + who the committee members approved, letters. During this time I lost contact with my son. I get very few social or family visits at the SHU, approximately one visit a year.

- My ability to interact with other prisoners is very limited as well. In my experience, 8. prisoners are given disciplinary write ups for merely talking to other prisoners. For example, in March 2011, I received a disciplinary violation simply for calling out to a prisoner in the next pod.
- My prolonged solitary confinement in Pelican Bay has caused me serious harm. I have 9. described and discussed this harm with the experts who have been retained by my lawyers in this case.
- I was one of the eleven principal negotiators and representatives for the prisoners at 10. Pelican Bay State Prison during the 2011 hunger strikes.
- I am interested in being a class representative in this case because I would like to 11. represent other prisoners who have experienced the same constitutional violations as I, and I want to help change and improve CDCR's policies. I share this common interest with all the other prisoners held in the Pelican Bay SHU, so I don't know of any reason why I would be unable to adequately represent them in our claims for injunctive and declaratory relief.
- I have been cooperating fully with my lawyers and am responding to their requests to the 12. best of my ability and recollection, and will continue to do that. My lawyers keep me

On September 29, 2008, an investigation was initiated by Institutional Gang Investigations Unit (IGI) in reference to validated Nuestra Familia (NF) member, George FRANCO, D-46556, aka "Puppet from San Jose," per the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Section 3378 (e), regarding his current gang status. FRANCO was validated as a member of the NF prison gang based upon a gang validation package submitted by Institutional Gang Investigator M. Randolph at Pelican Bay State Prison (PBSP) on August 14, 2002. The source items used to validate FRANCO are all over six (6) years old. Therefore, per CCR, Title 15, Section 3378 (e), FRANCO meets the criteria for an Active/Inactive Status Review.

- 1. Source Document (Written Material) Confidential Memorandum dated July 3, 2007, authored by Correctional Officer T. S. Buchanan, during a cell search of Antonio GUILLEN, P-81948, aka "Chuco," validated NF member, validated February 27, 1992, a calendar containing a roster of validated Northern Structure (NS) and Nuestra Familia (NF) affiliates was discovered. The information includes monikers and birthdays. Amid the names was "Puppet, August 6." This is the moniker and birthday for FRANCO. With FRANCO's moniker and birthday include in the roster of other NF/NS affiliates monikers and birthday's, shows that FRANCO is considered to be in good standings with the NF. To be in "good standings," the individual is functioning under the gang's policies, procedures, rules and guidelines.
- 2. **Source Document (Debrief)** Confidential Memorandum dated August 8, 2007, authored by Correctional Sergeant J. Bales. A confidential informant identified FRANCO in September 2006, as being in charge of the Street Regiment in Stanislaus County for the NF.
- 3. Source Document (Written Material) Confidential Memorandum dated October 16, 2007, authored by Correctional Officer C. Chadwick, during a cell search of Samuel LUNA, J-97489, aka "Huero," validated NS member, validated January 29, 2001, a single piece of lined paper containing ghost writing was discovered. The ghost writing contained a roster of validated Northern Structure (NS) and Nuestra Familia (NF) affiliates. The roster included monikers and corresponding codes. Amid the names was "Puppet, Sandra," this is the moniker for FRANCO. With FRANCO's moniker include in the roster of NF/NS affiliates monikers, shows that FRANCO is considered to be in good standings with the NF. To be in "good standings," the individual is functioning under the gang's policies, procedures, rules and guidelines.

- 4. Source Document (Correctional Officer R. Parrilla. A confidential informant identified FRANCO in January of 2005, as being in charge of the Street Regiment in Stockton, Tracy, Modesto, and Freemont for the NF.
- 5. **Source Document (Informant)** Confidential Memorandum dated April 10, 2008, authored by Correctional Officer D.E. Milligan. A confidential informant identified FRANCO as being the scribe for the General Advocate Office (GAO), which is David CERVANTES, C-06706, aka "DC," who is a validated NF member, validated September 25, 1979.
- 6. Source Document (Written Material) Confidential Memorandum dated October 3, 2008, authored Burris, during a cell search of Samuel Correctional Officer S. J-97489, aka "Huero," validated NS member, validated January 29, 2001, two rosters were discovered. The rosters of validated Northern Structure (NS) and Nuestra Familia (NF) affiliates, contained monikers along with corresponding codes. Amid the names was "Puppet, Peta, and Puppet, OdJIG." This is the moniker for FRANCO. With FRANCO's moniker include in two rosters of NF/NS affiliates, shows that FRANCO is considered to be in good standings with the NF. To be in "good standings," the individual is functioning under the gang's policies, procedures, rules and guidelines.

(Archives) FRANCO is still serving under his CDCR # D-46556, and does not have an archive file.

(WSIN) No additional information was provided by this source.

(Local Law Enforcement) Local law enforcement was not contacted as FRANCO has been in custody for the last six years.

(Paroles/Leads) Paroles were not contacted as FRANCO has been in custody for the last six years.

(Cal Gangs) No additional information was provided by this source.

(SSU/OCS) No additional information was provided by this source.

On October 1, 2008, FRANCO was cooperative with the taking of photographs for the update of his Active/Inactive Review. FRANCO has a Tabe Score of 9.1 and, therefore, does not require nor did he request staff assistance. FRANCO is not a participant in the Mental Health Delivery System.

Disclosure and Notification

On October 15, 2008, I disclosed all information used in the active/inactive review to FRANCO, and supplied him with three pre-printed itemized pages for his response. The confidential information was disclosed via CDCR 1030, Confidential Disclosure Information Forms. FRANCO was further advised that an interview regarding the information obtained during this investigation would be held not less than 24 hours from the time of this notification.

Interview

On October 16, 2008, FRANCO was interviewed, relative to the documents used in the review. FRANCO submitted the three (3) pre-printed pages I had supplied him for his response, addressing all confidential documents used in the review process, and stated he had nothing further to add to the interview.

During this Active/Inactive review period a thorough investigation of all pertinent documents contained in FRANCO's Central File for gang activity was completed by the PBSP investigator. During this review the investigator discovered 23 new documents evidencing FRANCO's gang activity. The investigator is submitting a portion of the documentation to the Office of Correctional Safety to demonstrate FRANCO's current active status.

Conclusion

After a thorough review of the evidence, I have concluded that George FRANCO, D-46556, aka "Puppet from San Jose." is actively participating as a member of the NF prison gang. This is supported by source items #1 thru #6. This information will be forwarded to the OCS to update FRANCO's gang status. At FRANCO's request, he will be eligible for an Inactive Gang Status Review after September 2014.

I, Jeffrey Franklin, declare under penalty of perjury that:

- 1. I am a 52-year-old prisoner who has spent the last 23 years in solitary confinement in a windowless cell at the Pelican Bay SHU.
- 2. The conditions at the Pelican Bay SHU are so harsh that in 2011 I requested to be transferred to any of the other three SHUs in California, where I would have a window in my cell. That request was denied.
- 3. I have been eligible for parole since 2000. Although the parole board has characterized my disciplinary history at Pelican Bay as minimal, it has repeatedly denied me parole. In 2001, I was explicitly told that, in order to expect a parole release date, I need to get out of the SHU.
- 4. My prolonged solitary confinement in Pelican Bay has caused me serious harm. I have described and discussed this harm with the experts who have been retained by my lawyers in this case.
- 5. In 2006, I was denied inactive status because I was listed as a board member of George Jackson University and because my name appeared on lists confiscated from other prisoners.
- 6. I had another inactive review in 2012. I was again found to be an active gang member, this time solely because my name appeared on a list in another prisoner's cell. Initially, I was also accused of having communicated with someone in another pod by yelling out to them, but the item was later discounted, as I was never housed in the relevant cell (nor was the other prisoner). True and correct copies of my 2012 inactive review documents can be found at Exhibit J.

- 7. I have engaged in no gang-related misconduct during my 23 years at the SHU, despite CDCR's classification of me as an active gang member. The source item relied on to retain me in the SHU for another six years does not allege any gang activity as I understand those words, nor any criminal conduct.
- 8. I am interested in being a class representative in this case because I would like to represent other prisoners who have experienced the same constitutional violations as I, and I want to help change and improve CDCR's policies. I share this common interest with all the other prisoners held in the Pelican Bay SHU, so I don't know of any reason why I would be unable to adequately represent them in our claims for injunctive and declaratory relief.
- 9. I have been cooperating fully with my lawyers and am responding to their requests to the best of my ability and recollection, and will continue to do that. My lawyers keep me updated as to the progress of the case. I am happy with their performance, and am confident that they will adequately represent me and the class.

On May 4, 2012, the Institutional Gang Investigations Unit (IGI), completed an investigation of Inmate FRANKLIN, Jeffrey, C-08545, moniker "Askari," regarding his current gang status. (Hereafter FRANKLIN will be referred to as SUBJECT) On June 5, 1981, SUBJECT was originally validated under CDCR number C-08545, as a member of the Black Guerrilla Family prison gang. Per the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Section 3378 (e), there is sufficient evidence to update SUBJECT's status as a member of the Black Guerrilla Family prison gang.

DISCLOSURE AND NOTIFICATION

SUBJECT has a TABE Score of 6.9, therefore, SUBJECT does not require staff assistance. SUBJECT is not a participant in the Mental Health Delivery System.

On May 3, 2012, at 1235 hours, SUBJECT was disclosed all information being utilized in the validation process. If applicable, SUBJECT was disclosed confidential information via CDCR 1030 Confidential Information Disclosure Form. SUBJECT was further advised an interview regarding the information obtained during this investigation would be held not less than 24-hours from the time of the disclosure.

INTERVIEW

On May 4, 2012, at 1250 hours, SUBJECT was interviewed regarding the documents utilized in the prison gang validation package to identify SUBJECT as a member of the Black Guerrilla Family prison gang. SUBJECT provided a written response addressing all documents used in the review process. SUBJECT was asked if he had anything further to add to his written rebuttal. SUBJECT stated, "I need to know who the roster was taken from in source item # 1." I informed SUBJECT the name of the individual which the roster was taken from was withheld due to safety concerns. SUBJECT stated, "But I may have tried to cell with this guy, and that is how he got my name and number." I informed SUBJECT that the roster consisted of many Black Guerrilla Family affiliates, and this individual did not write them down because he was attempting to cell with them, it was written down because he needed an accurate listing of affiliates. I then informed SUBJECT that I would inform the IGI of your concerns, and that he can make a decision on this matter. SUBJECT then stated, "I do not deny that my name and number were in the book, but I would like to know who it came from, in case I tried to cell with this individual.

CONCLUSION

Upon reviewing the written response and after a thorough review of the evidence, it was determined SUBJECT'S claims have merit and warrant further investigation. It was also determined that a reissuing of the 1030 Confidential Information Disclosure Form to elaborate on the author of the roster was an issue of safety for that individual, and a new 1030 would not be reissued. Also based on the written rebuttal provided by SUBJECT, he claims that source item number 2, should not be utilized as he was never housed in Facility D. Unit 2, Cell 203, as claimed by the

Also, SUBJECT claims that the CDCR 128-B dated September 16, 2010, does not articulate specific gangrelated activities as provided under California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Section 3378, (C) (8) (L) Communications. After researching the claims made by SUBJECT it was discovered that in fact he was never housed in Facility D. Unit 2, Cell 203, nor was the individual he was allegedly communicating with. It is also the opinion of the IGI that the CDCR 128- B dated September 16, 2010, does not clearly articulate specific gang-related activities on SUBJECT'S behalf. Therefore, source item number 2, will be excluded as information pertaining to continued gang activity of SUBJECT for this investigation.

The IGI has concluded there is sufficient evidence to identify FRANKLIN, Jeffrey, C-08545, moniker "Askari," as a member of the Black Guerrilla Family prison gang.

The aforementioned information will be forwarded to the Office of Correctional Safety for review and acceptance of SUBJECT'S prison gang validation.

I, Richard Johnson, declare under penalty of perjury that:

- I am 61 years old and have spent more than 15 years in solitary confinement at the
 Pelican Bay SHU due to my validation as a BGF member.
- 2. Under California's "three strikes" law, I am currently serving 33 years to life for drugrelated, non-violent offenses.
- I have never incurred a major disciplinary offense while serving my current sentence. Indeed, I have had only one rule violation in the 15 years I have spent at Pelican Bay SHU: in 2000 I was disciplined for a mail violation. I also got a 115 violation for participating in the September 2011 hunger strike, but it was later voided.
- 4. I suffer from serious medical conditions: osteoporosis, arthritis, hypertension, and cysts in both kidneys. I also had a heart attack in 2009 while in the SHU, and take heart medication. I was scheduled to be transferred to Folsom Prison because of my heart condition, but was later refused transfer after my participation in the Pelican Bay hunger strike. I have been told by one of the doctors here that the only path to better health care for my serious conditions is to debrief to get out of the SHU.
- My inactive reviews have largely focused on purported association with a gang. In 2010, I was denied inactive status based on my possession of a copy of "N-GOMA Pelican Bay Support Project, Black August 2005," a newsletter which includes dedications to alleged BGF members who have died; a copy of "New African Nation Towards Black August Memorial," a manuscript about African Nationalism; three pieces of artwork, including a drawing of me next to George Jackson; a confidential memorandum in which I was accused of being a member of a gang by an unnamed prisoner; an intercepted letter sent to me by another prisoner who inquired about my health and sent his respect; and my

- appearance on a roster of alleged gang members found in an unidentified prisoner's cell.

 True and correct copies of my 2010 inactive review documents can be found at Exhibit L.
- 6. None of the source items relied on to retain me in the SHU for another six years alleged any gang activity as I understand those words, nor any criminal conduct.
- 7. Indeed, as my disciplinary record demonstrates, I have not been involved in any violent or disruptive gang activity since my incarceration in 1997. Rather, I have been kept for such a long time at the SHU because of political materials in my possession.
- My prolonged solitary confinement in Pelican Bay has caused me serious harm. I have RT POD WILL DISCUSSION described and discussed this harm with the experts who have been retained by my lawyers in this case.
- 9. I am interested in being a class representative in this case because I would like to represent other prisoners who have experienced the same constitutional violations as I, and I want to help change and improve CDCR's policies. I share this common interest with all the other prisoners held in the Pelican Bay SHU, so I don't know of any reason why I would be unable to adequately represent them in our claims for injunctive and declaratory relief.
- 10. I have been cooperating fully with my lawyers and am responding to their requests to the best of my ability and recollection, and will continue to do that. My lawyers keep me updated as to the progress of the case. I am happy with their performance, and am confident that they will adequately represent me and the class.

On May 27, 2010, the property of JOHNSON was searched to ascertain any BGF gang-related information for his pending Active/Inactive Review Investigation. Discovered amid his personal property was a copy of "N-GOMA Pelican Bay Support Project" magazine. N-GOMA was founded by validated BGF member Gerald REED C-40517, aka "Gahisi Sowande" (deceased). The magazine is used by the BGF as a conduit to pass messages to and from members/associates.

The issue titled "Black August 2005" is a dedication to the passing of REED. The "Black August Movement" was established by the BGF to commemorate all their fallen comrades. Through out this issue, numerous members of the BGF have written dedications to REED.

One of the dedications on page seven of the magazine was written by BGF Supreme Commander Kenneth CARTER B-52119, aka "Fati". CARTER writes in part, "Please extend to any of his surviving relatives, heart-felt and belated condolences from his family behind the lines." Meaning BGF members still in prison.

BGF member James DOUGLAS H-64600, aka "Askari Yero" also wrote a dedication on page seven, indicating that he was housed in PBSP SHU during the same time REED was. He writes, "He was dedicated to the struggle...", indicating that he was committed to the BGF.

On page eight, BGF members Charles COLEMAN C-60680, aka "Iceberg"; James HOLIDAY D-46027, aka "Doc"; and James HARVEY C-48884, aka "Abdul O. Shakur", all wrote dedications to REED. HARVEY included in his dedication numerous names of BGF members who have died. Some of the names on the list were: W.L. Nolan, George Jackson (both are co-founders of the BGF), William Christmas, James McClain, Jonathan Jackson (George Jackson's brother) (all three of which were killed in the attempted escape plan from the Marin County Courthouse in 1970), and Jeffery Gaulden (assumed the leadership of the BGF after Jackson's death in August 1971). HARVEY closes his dedication with, "In Constant Armed Struggle. Guerrilla Love! Blood In My Eye!!" "Blood In My Eye," is a direct reference to the book Blood In My Eye, authored by George Jackson, which is disallowed at Pelican Bay State Prison (PBSP), due to it's nexus to the BGF prison gang and George Jackson.

On page ten, there are two dedications written by validated BGF member, Aron CASTLIN J-99402, aka "Akili".

Based upon the item found in JOHNSON's cell, it is clear that he continues to identify and associate with the BGF prison gang. This document will be considered as one point in the validation process of JOHNSON as a member of the BGF, as well as the BGF members who had written dedications in the publication. N-GOMA magazine is allowable material at PBSP; however inmate JOHNSON chose to retain this issue of the magazine for almost five years, demonstrating his continued loyalty to the BGF prison gang and its members. This document will be utilized as one source point of validation as prescribed in California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 15, Section 3378 (c) (8) (C), Written Material.

"NARN," stands for New Afrikan Revolutionary Nationalism (NARN), a term that has been identified as a front for the BGF. Within the manuscript are the historical facts of "Black August". "Black August" is a concept which was established by the BGF to commemorate all of their fallen comrades. The BGF picked the month of August due to the fact that several members and associates of the BGF had been killed in the month of August. These members include George Jackson (co-founder of the BGF, killed during an attempted escape from San Quentin State Prison on August 21, 1971,) Jeffery Gaulden (Commander of the BGF after the death of Jackson, killed during a football game at San Quentin State Prison on August 1, 1978), William Christmas, James McClain, and Jonathan Jackson (all three killed on August 7, 1970, during an attempted escape at the Marin County Courthouse,) death of Alvin Miller, Cleveland Edwards, and W. L. Nolan, who were shot and killed by correctional staff during an incident with the Aryan Brotherhood, (this incident actually took place on January 13, 1970, but BGF utilize the date of August 13, 1970, to commemorate their death.)
