I just got off the phone with the State Office of Legal Advisor on a couple of quick follow-up questions and want to provide you some additional information (I've copied Eric and Scott as well). Please also see the attached crew and Passenger lists for the Challenger I and Challenger II (Challenger I is associated with Challenger II), but we believe she may still be in Greece. This is a very serious situation from a foreign relations standpoint and may also implicate certain financial sanctions regimes under US law. It is emerging very quickly and it is quite possible that the White House may specifically task us on relatively short notice to take whatever actions we can. We are trying to lay the foundation for such action at present. A Principals Committee meeting may occur tomorrow on this subject. The extremely high level of political interest might necessitate a swift response from your staff to follow up this evening's forthcoming exchange with the Cypriots and put us in a good position to anticipate and respond to White House tasking. I have further asked State to identify a Legal Attache at a post in the region that might be available to assist, if necessary.

#### Captain,

I spoke with the US Embassy in Cyprus (specifically, the Special Agent in Charge of the Force Protection Detachment). He confirmed that the US Embassy knows about some of the activities of the Challenger I and II. He also stated that, as of last night (02JUN10), the government of Cyprus is officially denying entry of the Challenger ships into Cypriot territory.

Based on news websites, we have information that the Cypriot government denied the Challenger boats access to Cypriot territorial waters even to use small boats to ferry passengers from the Challenger 2 to Turkish ships involved in the Gaza flotilla. The Cypriot government also used helicopters to enforce this decision.

However, Cyprus does not control the northern half of their island (Turkish-occupied Cyprus). From news reports, it looks like the Challenger I pulled into the port of Famagusta in Turkish-occupied Cyprus for repairs on May 29th.

I am waiting for a call back from one of my contacts at the US Embassy in Turkey to determine what information they have about this situation.

There is some question about the nature of the passengers being carried onboard (are any for hire?). It may become necessary for ACTEUR to verify vessel is operating as recreational vessel (and not a UPV or SPV). Vessel is not documented for commercial service. I spoke with the US Embassy in Cyprus (specifically, the Special Agent in Charge of the Force Protection

Detachment). He confirmed that the US Embassy knows about some of the activities of the Challenger I and II. He also stated that, as of last night (02JUN10), the government of Cyprus is officially denying entry of the Challenger ships into Cypriot territory.

Based on news websites, we have information that the Cypriot government denied the Challenger boats access to Cypriot territorial waters even to use small boats to ferry passengers from the Challenger 2 to Turkish ships involved in the Gaza flotilla. The Cypriot government also used helicopters to enforce this decision.

However, Cyprus does not control the northern half of their island (Turkish-occupied Cyprus). From news reports, it looks like the Challenger I pulled into the port of Famagusta in Turkish-occupied Cyprus for repairs on May 29th.

I am waiting for a call back from one of my contacts at the US Embassy in Turkey to determine what information they have about this situation.

It may become necessary for ACTEUR to verify vessel is operating as recreational vessel (and not a UPV or SPV). Vessel is not documented for commercial service. This is a very serious situation from a foreign relations standpoint and may also implicate certain financial sanctions regimes under US law. It is emerging very quickly and it is quite possible that the White House may specifically task us on relatively short notice to take whatever actions we can. We are trying to lay the foundation for such action at present. A Principals Committee meeting may occur tomorrow on this subject. The extremely high level of political interest might necessitate a swift response from your staff to follow up this evening's forthcoming exchange with the Cypriots and put us in a good position to anticipate and respond to White House tasking. I have further asked State to identify a Legal Attache at a post in the region that might be available to assist, if necessary.

- We have a whole bunch of ships headed towards Gaza right now to "break the Israeli blockade." The Israeli Navy will probably interdict them this weekend, board the ships, haul them to port and deport all of the foreign nationals (they did this last summer). However, we have a slight hitch this time in that two of the boats, after leaving Greece, are now supposedly flying American flags rather than Greek ones. Embassy Athens is looking into this to find out of the boats are registered in Greece or the U.S.

The Israeli Embassy has contacted us about this, and they have been contacted by the Greek Ambassador here, who has stated these ships are flying U.S. flags (although he did not tell the Israelis if the boats are American or Greek registered). What are the consequences, if any, of flying the wrong states flag on a ship? - We have a whole bunch of ships headed towards Gaza right now to "break the Israeli blockade." The Israeli Navy will probably interdict them this weekend, board the ships, haul them to port and deport all of the foreign nationals (they did this last summer). However, we have a slight hitch this time in that two of the boats, after leaving Greece, are now supposedly flying American flags rather than Greek ones. Embassy Athens is looking into this to find out of the boats are registered in Greece or the U.S.

The Israeli Embassy has contacted us about this, and they have been contacted by the Greek Ambassador here, who has stated these ships are flying U.S. flags (although he did not tell the Israelis if the boats are American or Greek registered).

"The Israel Navy has expressed to me that they intend to respond to this situation as peaceful as possible; however they have been directed by the GOI to prevent the vessels from arriving in Gaza. Their intention is to ensure the ships arrive in Ashdod, process the individuals to be deported and deliver any legitimate humanitarian aide to Gaza via land. It should be noted, that GOI has made it clear that although they have directed a peaceful response, those participating are viewed as individuals deliberately attempting to provoke the Israel Navy and appropriate action to prevent arrival in Gaza will be taken."
