1. This is in reference to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) litigation from the Department of State (DOS) dated April 6, 2015 in which twenty-six classified documents were referred to our office for review, as identified in our enclosed index list (**see Tab A**).

Please note, after consulting with two subcomponents responsible for this type of information, we have determined that twenty-three documents were denied in their entirety under FOIA 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(1), as they are currently and properly classified in accordance with E.O. 13526 Section 1.4 (C), our final determination for these documents were previously coordinated through the Department of Defense, Freedom of Information Division, Litigation Support Office under DON case number DON-NAVY-2015-005268.

We have determined that one document, identified on our index list as: C05705690, portions of this document are denied under FOIA 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(1), in accordance with E.O. 13526 Section 1.4 (C) & (D); some portions are denied under FOIA 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6) and (b)(7)(E) an explanation of the exemptions claimed is provided in the index list. Furthermore some portions were deemed not responsive to this request, per DOS guidance; "requester is only seeking specific information about the incident and not interested in any other information that does not pertain to the incident".

4. (U) CRIME

#

A. (U) The U.S. Department of State assesses the criminal threat in Turkey is LOW. Narcotics, such as ecstasy and hashish, are available and may be offered by vendors and taxi drivers in most tourist areas. Penalties for the use, sale, or possession of narcotics are harsh and the release of U.S. citizens charged with such crimes is unlikely. Bail does not exist and the trial process can take up to a year. Entrapment is legal in Turkey, and up to half of drug dealers are believed to be undercover police.

Personnel can avoid exposure to the virus by staying away from poultry facilities with live birds, not handling any dead birds they might find (either in a market or just laying around), and consuming only fully cooked foods.



Appeals should be in writing to: The Office of the Judge Advocate General (Code 14), Department of the Navy, 1322 Patterson Avenue, SE, Suite 3000, Washington Navy Yard, DC 20374-5066. The appeal must be received in that office within 60 calendar days from the date of the requester's letter in order to be considered. The requester should provide a statement regarding why the appeal should be granted and include a copy of the original request with the appeal letter. It is recommended that the letter of appeal and the envelope both bear the notation of "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."




