Dear Ms. Gallagher,

I refer you to our letter dated October 24, 2016, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. §552.

The searches of the individual emails of Jacob Sullivan and the state.gov emails of Cheryl Mills have been completed and resulted in the retrieval of nine additional documents responsive to your request. After reviewing these nine documents we have determined that three may be released in full, five may be released in part, and one must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed.

Where a document was released to you in part, all non-exempt material that was reasonably segregable from the exempt material was released. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. Of the information withheld in full, all was withheld under FOIA Exemption 1, 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(1). An enclosure provides information on FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material.

UN HUMAN RIGHTS PANEL: ISRAEL BROKE INTERNATIONAL LAW

(SBU) The report, which the UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC) will debate on September 27, said Israel's military response to the Gaza flotilla and the Gaza blockade are unlawful, media report. The Israel and Palestinian Affairs Office comments the report was more critical of Israel than anticipated and Embassy Ankara adds Turkey will embrace the report as vindication of their position. USUN Geneva notes the Turkish delegation will put forward a resolution rebuking Israeli actions and Israel is expected to disengage from UNHRC debate on this issue.

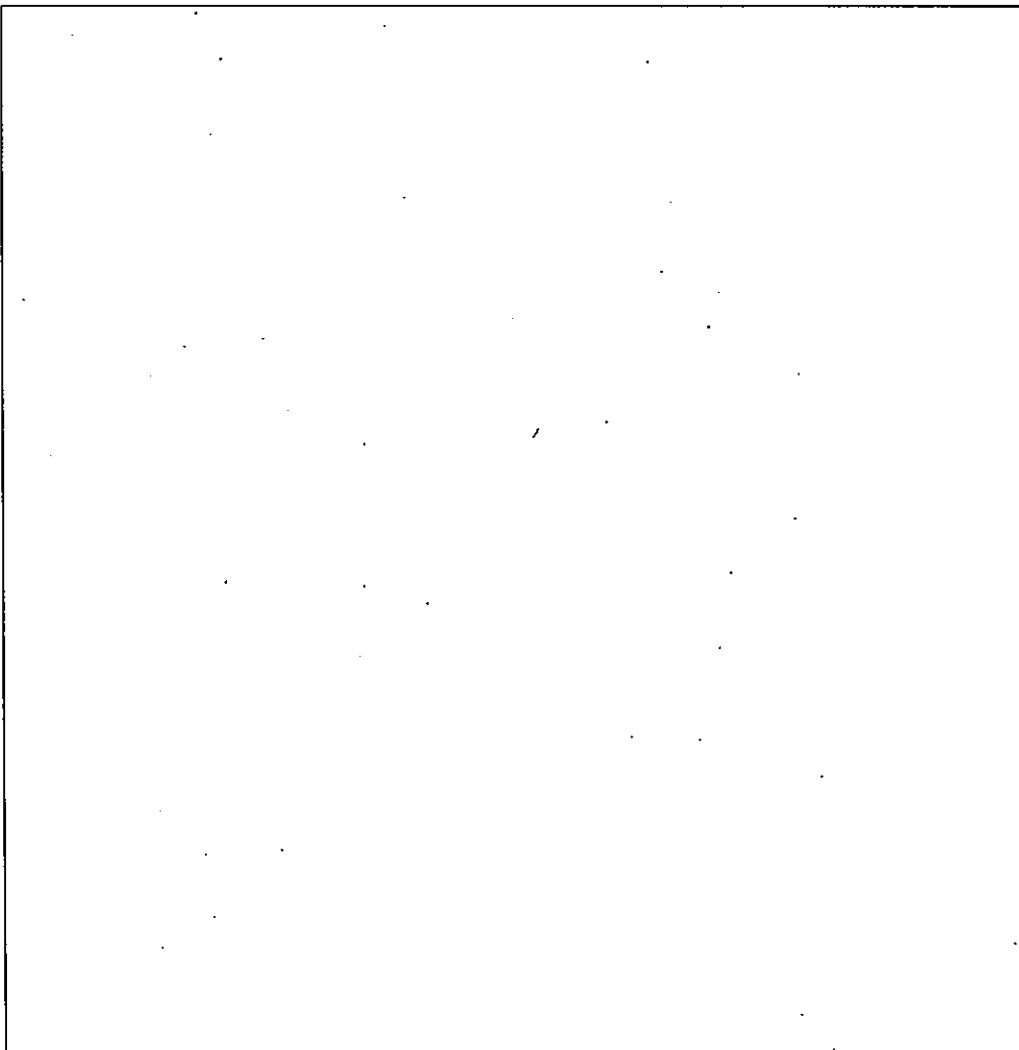
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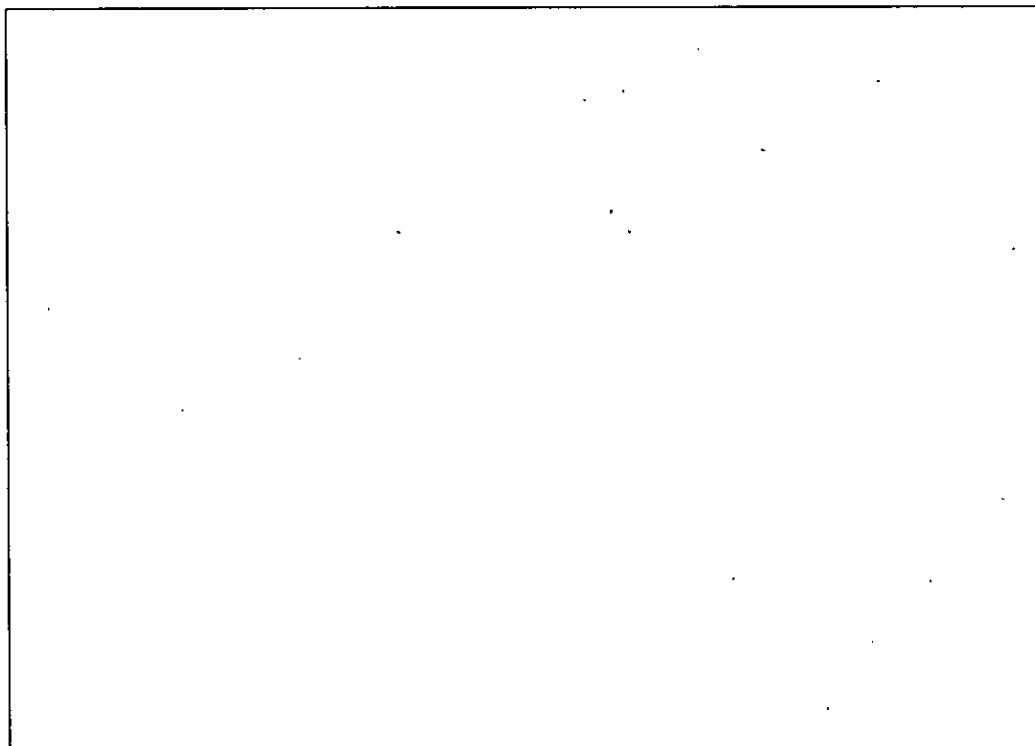

15. (SBU) Political relations between Turkey and Israel have reached their lowest point in a generation, although people-to-people contacts continue and trade has increased. Turks across the political spectrum are deeply angered and disappointed at PM Netanyahu's refusal to apologize and provide compensation for the deaths of eight Turkish citizens and one Turkish-American during the Israeli Defense Force's raid on the Mavi Marmara in

international waters in May 2010. After the leaking of the Palmer Commission report in September 2011, Turkey took a series of measures against Israel, including downgrading, but not breaking, diplomatic relations. The Turks have also followed through with threats to obstruct Israel's participation in international fora. The United States encourages both Israel and Turkey to seek opportunities to move beyond the recent strains and make efforts to improve their bilateral relations. Many Turkish leaders recognize the importance of improved relations. They have kept open channels of communication and maintain they are prepared to restore

relations immediately when the Israeli government meets their conditions, the most difficult of which has been an apology.
