Israel advocacy organizations leverage their significant resources and lobbying power to pressure universities and government actors to censor or punish advocacy in support of Palestinian rights by employing a variety of tactics.

Threats to Academic Freedom

Prof. Steven Salaita was fired from his tenured position because of his tweets critical of Israel's 2014 attack on Gaza.

Administrative Sanctions

Student organizers and groups have been subjected to probation, bans on holding leadership positions, fines, investigations and even suspension.
