Thank you, Mr. President.

We deeply regret the tragic loss of life and injuries suffered among those involved in the incident aboard the Gaza-bound ships last spring. We have repeatedly underscored the importance of a credible, impartial, and transparent investigation into the tragic events of May 31, 2010. We are committed to working with partners, including our longstanding friends Israel and Turkey, to ensure a full and appropriate response to the incident and the circumstances that led to it.

The tragic flotilla incident underscores the need to move ahead quickly with negotiations that can lead to a comprehensive Arab-Israeli peace, including two states, Israel and Palestine, living side-by-side in peace and security.

The United States remains concerned by conditions in Gaza, but notes that the humanitarian situation has significantly improved over the last year, including a marked increase in the range and scope of goods and materials moving into Gaza, an increase in international project activity, and the gradual expansion of exports. The United States will continue to work with Israel, the Palestinian Authority, donors, and the international community to do more and ensure that the needs of the people of Gaza are being met. Mechanisms are in place to transfer humanitarian assistance to Gaza, and they should be used by those seeking to provide assistance for the benefit of ordinary Gazans. We urge all those wishing to deliver goods to do so through established channels so their cargo can be inspected and transferred via land crossings into Gaza-to ensure that Israel's legitimate security needs are addressed even as the Palestinians' humanitarian needs are met. We join the Secretary -General in his call on all Governments concerned to use their influence to discourage future flotillas, which carry the potential for escalation

We commend the steps taken to expand access to goods in Gaza. We will continue to engage the Government of Israel to expand the scope and type of goods allowed into Gaza to address the full range of the population's needs, and to increase the ability of Gazans to export their produce and products. We will continue to work closely with the Government of Israel and the Palestinian Authority, along with international NGOs and the UN, to provide adequate access for humanitarian goods, including reconstruction materials, through the border crossings, even as we bear in mind the Government of Israel's legitimate security concerns.

We commend the Secretary General's constructive initiative in convening a panel to receive and review the results of Israel and Turkey's national investigations. The work of the panel is ongoing. The panel proceedings have been conducted in a positive and collegial manner. We continue to regard this panel as the primary method for the international community to review the incident. We note that the Human Rights Council Fact-Finding Mission report referred to these ongoing processes and did not recommend further UN action on this matter. The United States was opposed to Resolution 14/1, which handed this Fact-Finding Mission a flawed mandate -something the Mission itself acknowledged in its report.

The United States opposed Resolution 15/1 and 16/20, and for the same reasons, we oppose the current resolution. CLINTON

9. (U) Relations with Turkey further deteriorated following the May 2010 IDF interdiction of a flotilla intending to break the Israeli naval blockade of the Gaza Strip. Nine Turkish activists - including a dual American citizen - were killed in the IDF's intervention of the passenger ship Mavi Marmara. Israel remains concerned by plans to launch another flotilla in the coming months, although the decision by the Turkish NGO IHH to postpone its involvement in this next flotilla may have been prompted by Turkish President Erdogan. PM Netanyahu recently sent Erdogan a congratulatory letter following Erdogan's re-election. As a result, some Israeli analysts believe that an Israel-Turkey rapprochement is possible, especially given Turkey's condemnation of Asad's use of violence in Syria. Nevertheless, press reporting indicates as many as 10 ships - including an U.S. ship named the "Audacity of Hope" - may participate from several European ports in this second flotilla. Israeli officials are exploring all options, and have approached the USG for assistance.

3. (SBU) The free concert was open to the public, and the event was widely promoted, including among our own Consulate staff. In the days preceding the concert, Gulenist news outlets such as *Today's Zaman* ran several stories promoting the concert, including an interview with Ron, in which he repeatedly emphasized his respect for Islamic culture, his fascination with music produced by Muslims across the world, and his desire to "alleviate national, racial, religious, and cultural divides." The weekly newspaper of Istanbul's Jewish community, *Salom*, also publicized the event, noting (incorrectly) that invitations could be obtained at the Israeli Consulate.

4. (SBU) Yeni Akit, a confrontational Islamist newspaper, published an article on June 9 that characterized the band as a "Zionist Israeli-origin musical band" whose goal was to "provoke sensitive Muslims." Media reports indicate that the Mavi Marmara Volunteers, a group previously unknown to us, also released a statement on that morning calling the concert an intentional provocation only days after the 31 May anniversary of the Free Gaza Flotilla incidents. GYV disputed the claims of the protestors, noting that the ensemble's goal was to perform music from Jewish, Christian, and Islamic faiths and to promote intercultural dialogue through shared cultural values. Nonetheless, the organizers later cancelled the concert without public notice.

2010 violent confrontation between Israeli forces and activists on board the Turkish ship M/V Mavi Marmara when that vessel, and others, attempted to break Israel's maritime blockade of Gaza. That incident has had serious and long-lasting negative repercussions in the region and beyond.

We are concerned that a number of groups are organizing a flotilla to breach Israel's maritime blockade of Gaza on the one-year anniversary of the Mavi Marmara incident. Possible groups involved in this "anniversary flotilla" effort include the Free Gaza Movement, the European Campaign to End the Siege on Gaza, the U.S. Boat to Gaza organization, and the Turkish Foundation for Human Rights and Freedoms and Humanitarian Relief (IHH). Organizers are gathering up to 15 or more ships with the intention of arriving in Gaza around the fourth week of June.

The Israeli government has offered all ships wishing to deliver humanitarian aid to Gaza the opportunity to unload their cargo at the port of Ashdod for inspection before delivery to Gaza. The M/V Rachel Corrie delivered humanitarian assistance to Gaza through this mechanism in June 2010, resulting in the assistance moving quickly to Gaza.

The United States notes that the humanitarian situation in Gaza has significantly improved over the last year, including through large increases in the range and scope of goods and materials moving in, an increase in international project activity, and the gradual expansion of exports. We will continue to work with Israel, the Palestinian Authority, and others to do more to ensure that the needs of Gazans are being met.

Recent seizures by Israel and Egypt of advanced military systems, weapons, and ammunition bound for terrorist groups in Gaza, as well as ongoing rocket and mortar attacks from Gaza against Israeli civilians, highlight the continuing problem of the smuggling of illicit arms or goods that could be used to produce arms to Gaza. This underscores the need for security inspection of cargo bound for Gaza. We believe there must be appropriate measures to ensure that arms smuggling to terrorist groups is not taking place.

We therefore strongly urge groups seeking to send humanitarian assistance to Gaza to use existing non-provocative and non-confrontational mechanisms to ensure delivery of aid to Gaza and to allow for a security inspection of the goods being transferred. The purpose of the impending flotilla seems to be more about making a political statement than actually improving the lives of Gazans. Attempts by the flotilla to deliver goods directly to Gaza, without allowing security inspections, would be neither appropriate nor responsible.

The United States hopes that your government will do everything legally possible to prevent another flotilla confrontation. Given the tumult in the region, another violent incident poses significant political risk and also a real risk to safety of life at sea.

There are a number of specific steps we ask that you consider:

-- We urge you to speak out publicly about the potential safety risks involved in attempting to breach the blockade, the importance of ensuring that goods moving to Gaza are screened for illicit weapons smuggling or dual-use materials, and that any organization seeking to deliver humanitarian assistance to Gaza should use the existing mechanisms for the transfer of such assistance.

-We ask that your government reach out privately to flotilla organizers in your country with the same message, stressing that there are existing, non-provocative mechanisms for the delivery of humanitarian goods to Gaza. Humanitarian assistance for Gaza can be delivered via Israel's Ashdod port, which the government of Israel has indicated will be available for this purpose.

The anniversary flotilla plans, as far as we can determine, are subject to continuous change. We would appreciate any information you may have on these plans, or flotilla participants, that you are able to share.

We are also expressing to Israel the need for careful planning in how it might intercept flotilla vessels, and restraint in dealing with civilians aboard those vessels.

In view of the new attempt to break the Gaza naval blockade, the UN Secretary General expressed his conviction that humanitarian aid for Gaza should be supplied through official channels and asked the member states of the UN - and particularly those with access to the Mediterranean - to discourage such operations, which run the risk of escalating the violence. Greece's positions on the need to lift the Gaza blockade and improve the humanitarian situation in the region are well known. Equally well known is Greece's position of principle on the need to respect international law and avoid the use of violence. We have made these positions clear to all the interested parties, The Foreign Ministry - bearing in mind the UN Secretary General's request, the Israeli government's stated intention not to allow vessels to approach the Gaza coast and the immediate danger to human life entailed in participation in the operation in question, particularly in light of last year's events - urges Greek citizens as well as Greek-registered vessels not to participate in the new flotilla headed for the Gaza port. The government is responsible for planning and exercising the country's foreign policy, based on the promotion of Greece's interests. In this critical state of affairs, everyone needs to show similar responsibility or take full responsibility for their actions. The planned operation does not deal with the substance of the humanitarian problem in Gaza. In the past, Greece and Cyprus have made specific proposals in the direction of meeting the humanitarian needs of Gaza residents. The potential for implementing these proposals was also discussed at the recent meeting of the two countries' Foreign Ministers in Nicosia. The ultimate objective remains the full lifting of the Gaza blockade. Greece actively supports the reopening of the peace talks as the only path to a comprehensive and viable solution on the Palestinian problem.

1. (C) Acting Political Counselor delivered ref A demarche June 22 to MFA Assistant Secretary for Middle East Peace Process Ferooze Ali. Ali confirmed that a small number of Malaysians would take part in the flotilla, and noted the Prime Minister had publicly acknowledged Malaysia's participation. He had no substantial comments on our demarche, but promised to take our concerns into consideration.

2. (C) Comment: Although Malaysia's participation in the flotilla is not officially sponsored, several political figures (including the Youth Director of the ruling United Malays National Organization political party) will be among the ten Malaysians joining the flotilla. Prime Minister Najib has publicly referred to these ten as "heroes."
