Key Issues at Hearing: The attendees were seriously concerned that the Corps is allowing another pipeline to be constructed through the Atchafalaya Basin even though there are already existing, abandoned, and failing ones that have destroyed the water quality from 144 spills last year alone. Spoil banks from the oil

pipeline have depleted the crawfishing industry as well as caused fishing and trapping to decline. They want the oil industry to fix damages to the wetlands, the Atchafalaya Basin and the LA coast due to the devastation caused by oil spills in our state. They are mostly concerned with the health effects of serious water pollution caused by contamination from the 125,000 miles of oil pipelines in our state as well. They want Bayou Bridge to develop a comprehensive EIS, and to be held to the highest standard of technology and safety. The constituents also want DEQ and the Corps to consider all of those represented as the voice of opposition to the project and reject it. They also want Bayou Bridge to file this water quality certification and DA Corps permit application under the parent company, not the LLC.
