**REPLY TO TIGERSWAN’S OPPOSITION
TO PETITION TO INTERVENE**

Petitioning organizations (“Petitioners”) seeking to intervene in the appeal of TigerSwan, LLC, of its license denial by this Board, submit the following reply to TigerSwan’s Opposition to the Petition for Intervention.

TigerSwan cites no legal authority whatsoever for its argument that Petitioners should not be allowed to intervene in this proceeding. Petitioners have a justiciable interest in this matter because they would be particularly vulnerable and exposed to the irresponsible, dangerous, and reckless actions and conduct of TigerSwan if it is granted a license to operate in Louisiana.

Procedural History

On or about June 19, 2017, TigerSwan, a private security company based in Apex, North Carolina, applied to the Louisiana State Board of Private Security Examiners (“the Board” or “LSBPSE”) for a license to operate in Louisiana. On July 17, 2017, the Board denied TigerSwan’s application, reportedly in part on the basis that “they were denied licensure twice in Dakota and are pending litigation.”¹ TigerSwan appealed the denial of its application and is awaiting a hearing. On November 9, 2017, the Petitioning Organizations, 350 New Orleans, Atchafalaya Basinkeeper, Gulf Restoration Network, L’eau Est la Vie (“Water Is Life”) Camp,

Louisiana Bucket Brigade, and Louisiana Crawfish Producers Association-West, moved to intervene in TigerSwan's appeal as parties in interest.² On March 8, 2018, TigerSwan served Petitioners with its Opposition to their Petition to Intervene.

Law and Argument

This Board has discretion to allow parties in interest to intervene in adjudications.³ TigerSwan's brief cites no legal authority at all to suggest otherwise.

TigerSwan suggests that Petitioners have no "justiciable interest in this proceeding" because their interest "is in opposing the Bayou Bridge Pipeline." Opp. Brief at 1. However, Petitioners' work to oppose this particular pipeline is precisely what makes them vulnerable to reckless and dangerous actions and conduct of TigerSwan if it is granted a license to operate in this state and provide security services for the company constructing the pipeline.

TigerSwan also failed to note that the Petition described in great detail the Petitioners' specific concerns about TigerSwan, which are based on indepth reporting, leaked internal documents, as well as court documents from other states where TigerSwan has operated. *See* Petition to Intervene, ¶¶ 7-34. In fact, Petitioners detailed the targeting of a member of one of the petitioning organizations in a defamatory smear campaign in which TigerSwan is alleged to be involved in separate civil rights litigation in Pennsylvania. *Id.* at ¶¶ 19-25.

Moreover, through a public records request to the LSBPSE, Petitioners obtained a transcript of a deposition of a TigerSwan employee who sought a license through this Board after

TigerSwan’s application was rejected without notifying the Board that she was working for TigerSwan at the time. *See* Deposition of Lisa Smith (“Smith Deposition”), before the Louisiana State Board of Private Security Examiners, Sept. 19, 2017, annexed hereto as Exhibit A. As noted above, TigerSwan was denied a license to operate in Louisiana on July 19, 2017. According to the Louisiana Secretary of State, Smith’s company LTSA, LLC, filed its registration papers with the state on August 3, 2017. *See* LTSA, LLC, Registration, Louisiana Secretary of State, annexed hereto as Exhibit B. According to the LSBPSE’s website, Smith applied for a license for LTSA to operate as a private security company in Louisiana on August 4, 2017.⁴ According to her deposition, she was employed at TigerSwan and had been since February 2016, but failed to disclose that on her application materials. Smith Deposition at pp. 7:24-25, 8:1-11, 11:15-25. Also, according to the deposition, TigerSwan was present through its counsel. *Id.* at 3.

In light of the concerns set out in the petition to intervene and raised by the application of a TigerSwan employee who did not disclose that status with the board, TigerSwan representatives should be questioned about their awareness of or possible role in these efforts, and any others that may violate the law governing private security companies, and/or serve as a basis for denial of a license application, such as:

- La. R.S. 37:3289(4) – Efforts to deceive or defraud the public;
- La. R.S. 37:3289(8) – Aiding or abetting a person to evade the provisions of this Chapter or knowingly combining or conspiring with an unlicensed person, or acting as an agent, partner, associate or otherwise, of an unlicensed person with intent to evade provisions of this Chapter;
- La. R.S. 37:3276.1(B)(b) – whether TigerSwan “pose[s] a threat to the public interest of this state or to the effective regulation of private security companies,” or “create[s] or enhance[s] the dangers of unsuitable, unfair, or illegal practices, methods, and

operations in the activities authorized” by the law governing private security companies.

- La. R.S. 37:3276(G) – prohibiting applicants from “soliciting or operating a private security business prior to being issued a license.”

As described more fully in the Petition to Intervene, TigerSwan’s prior activities and associations demonstrate all too clearly that Petitioners have cause for concern that it poses a serious threat to public safety, particularly to those Louisiana residents and organizations opposed to the pipeline it would provide security and other services for.

Petitioners all have a demonstrable and tangible stake and concern in this proceeding as they fall into the category of opponents to a pipeline project pursued by a company that has contracted with TigerSwan in connection with related projects in other states. Their legitimate and serious concerns based on the evidence and reports of TigerSwan activities elsewhere should be made part of the record of the proceedings in this matter for any subsequent judicial review.

5 testify as follows:

6 EXAMINATION

7 MS. AUCOIN: (BEGINNING AT 9:40 A.M.)

8 Q Like I said before, my name is Adrienne
9 Aucoin. I'm an attorney for the Board of Private
10 Security Examiners. I'm just going to ask you a
11 couple of questions. Have you ever -- well, first,
12 please state your name for the record.

13 A Lisa Smith.

14 Q And what's your address?

15 A 2204 Maybrook Drive, Raleigh, North
16 Carolina 27610.

17 Q Have you ever been deposed before?

18 A No.

19 Q Okay. So I just want to, you know, give
20 you a few little things before we start. Just make
21 sure you answer out loud. Don't nod your head so
22 the court reporter can record your answers. And if
23 you don't understand my questions, just let me know
24 and I will rephrase it or repeat it. Okay?

25 A Yes.

1 Q Okay. Did you do anything to prepare for
2 today's deposition?

3 A No.

4 Q Okay. Did you meet with your lawyer?

5 A Yes.

6 Q Okay. Was anyone else present?

7 A Other than the lawyer?

8 Q Correct.

13 A I work in the Security Operations Center.
14 And, basically, what we do is -- just keep watch of
15 all the accounts that they have, anything that's
16 going on, whether it be weather, criminal
17 activities, just to report to let the clients know
18 that's in the area, what's going on in the area.

19 Q Okay. So you know James Reese?

20 A I do.

21 Q Okay. And what is his relationship with
22 Tigerswan?

23 A He's the CEO.

24 Q Are there any other CEOs or owners of
25 Tigerswan?

1 A Not to my knowledge.

2 Q And how long have you known Mr. Reese?

3 A I've seen Mr. Reese maybe three, four
4 times. I don't know him.

5 Q Did you know him prior to your employment
6 with Tigerswan?

7 A No.

8 Q And who hired you to be employed with
9 Tigerswan?

10 A I don't understand.

11 Q When you were hired, who did you
12 interview with Tigerswan?

13 A I interviewed with the Human Resource
14 Director Loretta Moran and Todd Walker.

15 Q Are you aware that Tigerswan applied for
16 license with the Board of Private Security
17 Examiners in Louisiana?

18 A I am.

19 Q Are you aware that they were denied that
20 application?

21 A I am.

22 Q When were you made aware of that denial?

23 A I don't recall the exact time frame.

24 Q Do you recall the circumstances of how
25 you became aware of that denial?

1 A Just from talk, just office talk.

2 Q Are you the owner of LTSA, LLC?

3 A I am.

4 Q And what does LTSA stand for, if
5 anything?

6 A It doesn't stand for anything.

7 Q When did you first create LTSA, LLC?

8 A When I applied for the application here
9 in Louisiana.

10 Q Do you recall when that was?

11 A In the month of August.

12 Q And what business does LTSA engage in or
13 does it intend to engage in?

11 A I don't know.

12 Q Okay. Have you ever spoken to anyone
13 with the Bayou Bridge?

14 A No, not to my knowledge.

15 Q I'm going to show this to you and I'm

17 don't mind, if you can take a look at that and
18 describe, I guess, what document I've placed in
19 front of you for the record?

20 A That's my resume'.

12 If there's no objection, I'd like to have
13 that as Exhibit #A to the deposition.

14 MR. WHITTINGTON:

15 Okay. Can you tell me where it came
16 from? Did she submit this?

17 BY MS. AUCOIN:

18 Q Oh, I'm sorry. Is this -- when you
19 applied for your license with the Board of Private
20 Security of Examiners, did you submit this resume'
21 in connection with that?

22 A I did.

23 MR. WHITTINGTON:

24 Look at all three pages.

25 MS. AUCOIN:

1 Yeah, take your time.

2 MR. WHITTINGTON:

3 Make sure it's complete.

4 A Yes.

5 MR. WHITTINGTON:

6 Yes out loud.

7 A Yes. Yes.

8 MS. AUCOIN:

9 Any objection?

10 MR. WHITTINGTON:

11 None.

12 MS. AUCOIN:

13 Okay. I'll label this as Board #1 for
14 the record.

15 BY MS. AUCOIN:

16 Q And who pays you your salary if you're
17 salaried?

18 A I get paid by Tigerswan.

19 Q Have you ever -- do you have a LinkedIn
20 profile or any type of social media tied in with
21 your employment?

22 A I have a LinkedIn profile.

23 Q LinkedIn profile. Okay. Have you ever
24 stated on your profile that you've been employed by
25 Tigerswan?

1 A Yes.

2 Q You have. Okay. Is it still listed as a
3 place of your -- that you're employed by today?

4 A I don't remember.

5 Q Okay. I'm going to, I guess, place this
6 in front of her. So you said a moment ago that you
7 have listed Tigerswan as a place of your employment
8 on your LinkedIn profile?

9 A I did not say that.

10 Q Okay. And, I guess refresh --

11 A I said I don't remember.

12 Q You don't remember. Okay. Could you
13 take a look at what I have placed in front of you?

14 A Yes.

13 Q Could you, I guess, identify what's
14 contained in the body of the email?

15 MR. WHITTINGTON:

16 If you know.

17 BY MS. AUCOIN:

18 Q If you know.

19 A This contains some of what my LinkedIn
20 page states.

21 Q Okay. Indicating that at one point in
22 time, you listed Tigerswan as a place of your
23 employment?

24 A Correct. Yes.

25 MS. AUCOIN:

1 Okay. I'd like to offer this as Exhibit
2 #B, unless you have any objections?

3 MR. RHODES:

4 Well, I mean, real quick question.
5 Procedurally, have you offered the -- that
6 document as Exhibit A? Has it been offered
7 yet?

8 MS. AUCOIN:

9 Exhibit 1, yes, if I didn't officially
10 follow through.

11 MR. WHITTINGTON:

12 You did because she identified it as
13 being true and correct.

14 MR. RHODES:

15 Okay.

16 MS. AUCOIN:

17 Yes.

18 MR. WHITTINGTON:

19 She has not identified this as being true
20 and correct. You can attach it. But if
21 you're going to use it as evidence, it's not
22 been authenticated.

23 So we would object to it as being used in
24 evidence, but you could attach it as being
25 referred to as Board #2.

1 MS. AUCOIN:

2 Okay. That's fine.

3 MR. WHITTINGTON:

4 Okay.

5 MR. RHODES:

6 One and two or A and B?

7 MR. WHITTINGTON:

8 One and two. I'm sorry.

9 MR. RHODES:

10 Okay.

11 MR. CROUCH:

12 Let's take a break.

13 MR. WHITTINGTON:

14 Okay.

15 (A short recess was taken in the
16 proceedings.)

17 MR. WHITTINGTON:

18 She has a correction.

19 BY MS. AUCOIN:

20 Q Okay.

21 A Yes. The month that I obtained the

23 August.

2 security company in Louisiana?

3 A The opportunities were good.

4 Q Have you had any contacts with Louisiana
5 prior to opening the company, LTSA; correct?

6 A As far as opening a company?

7 Q Any contacts with Louisiana period?

8 A Yes. I visited Louisiana before.

9 Q And why did you decide to set up your own
10 private security company while you're currently
11 working for one private security company?

12 A Because the contract that I was working
13 at Metlife was ending, so I needed a job. And I
14 knew that I needed to move forward on trying to
15 establish something else before that contract
16 ended.

17 Q Okay.

18 A And that's when I reached out.

19 Q Okay. And when is your contract with,
20 you said, Met -- is it Metlife?

21 A Yes.

22 Q When is that supposed to expire?

23 A It has. It's already expired.

24 Q So the reason you set up your company
25 wasn't in response in any way, shape, or form to

1 Tigerswan's application denial?

2 A That's correct.

3 Q It was in response to the denial?

4 A No, it was not.

5 Q I just wanted to make sure we're on the
6 same page. What kind of private security prospects
7 do you have for your business?

8 A I don't have any.

9 Q Okay. And whose paying for your office
10 space?

11 A I am.

12 Q Okay. And do you have any intention to
13 bid on any contracts dealing with Bayou Bridge or
14 the Dakota Pipeline?

15 A I don't know.

16 MS. AUCOIN:

17 I don't think I have any other questions
18 unless one of y'all do?

19 MR. RHODES:

20 Do you have any questions?

21 MR. WHITTINGTON:

22 I have one question or maybe a couple of
23 questions.

24 BY MR. WHITTINGTON:

25 Q You said that LTSA doesn't stand for

1 anything in particular; does it?

2 A That is correct.

3 Q But the letters are chosen from
4 something.

5 A From loved ones in my family.

6 Q Okay. And L would be?

7 A Lisa.

8 Q And the T would be?

9 A Tracey.

10 Q Who is she?

11 A Tracey is my Goddaughter.

12 Q And Stacy would be who?

13 A That's my brother.

14 Q And that's the S.

15 A The S.

16 Q And then A would be who?

17 A Aaron, my son.

18 Q Okay. And that's the reason you chose
19 those letters?

20 A Yes.

21 MR. WHITTINGTON:

22 All right. Thank you.

23 BY MS. AUCOIN:

24 Q Okay. And you have no connection with
25 Tigerswan other than your employment?

1 A I don't understand the question.

2 Q Your only relationship to Tigerswan is
3 that you're employed by them; correct?

4 A That's correct.

5 MS. AUCOIN:

6 I think that's it.

7 MR. WHITTINGTON:

8 Okay. She's going to read and sign.

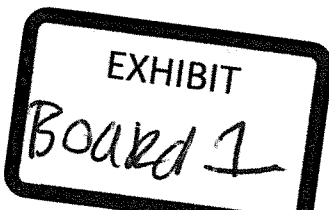
